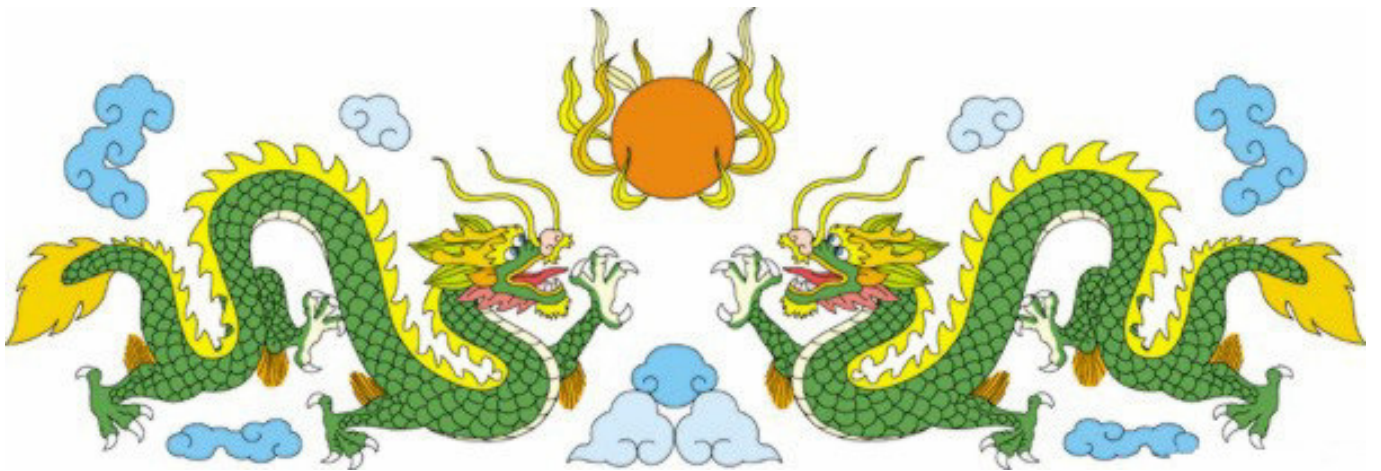

Holy Island of Lindisfarne Empowerment

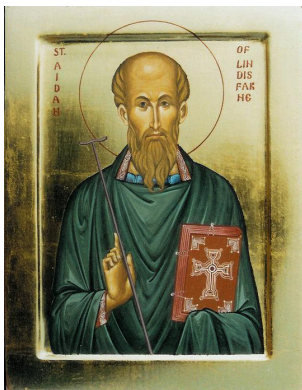
"Holy" islands can be found in many places and in connection with a wide variety of religious beliefs and traditions. The writer of this short manual is also the originator of the LightWorker™ Knights of Saint Columba Empowerment. Columba spent much of his life on the little island of Iona on the west coast of Scotland, part of the series of islands known as the Inner Hebrides. Iona, with its monastery and abbey, was to become the burial place of Scottish kings and, to this day, remains a place of peace and pilgrimage.

Lindisfarne, which has a direct connection with Iona, is on the other side of the United Kingdom, just off the east coast of Northumbria and not far south of the border between Scotland and England. To this day, it is approached by a causeway that is covered by the tide twice every day, thus ensuring that Lindisfarne maintains its status as a true island.



Christianity probably first came to Northumbria through Roman soldiers who guarded Hadrian's Wall, which lies the south of Lindisfarne, roughly from the Tyne to the Solway. However, in the seventh century there was a dramatic increase in Christian missionary work.

In 625 Paulinus came north with the pagan King Edwin and his Christian Queen, Ethelburga. Paulinus subsequently converted and baptised Edwin and several thousand of his subjects. When Oswald succeeded Edwin as king he requested the religious community on Iona to send one of their monks to Northumbria. In response to this request Aidan was sent in 635 and settled initially at Bamburgh on the coast where he built a wooden church. With the support of Oswald,



Aidan began to spread the Christian Gospel throughout the area. In due course, Aidan was consecrated as Bishop of Lindisfarne and established a monastery that became a place of prayer, devotion, spirituality, learning and missionary outreach. From Lindisfarne many churches were founded, from Edinburgh in the north to the Humber in the south. Among those educated in the monastery of Lindisfarne were Saint Chad, Saint Egbert, Saint Oswy and Saint Wilfred.

One of the most famous successors to Aidan as Bishop of Lindisfarne was Cuthbert (consecrated 685), a man of great intellect and spirituality. He became Prior of Lindisfarne in 664 and subsequently left for a life of solitude and prayer on the nearby island of Inner Farne where he eventually died. Lindisfarne Priory became a shrine and place of pilgrimage when the body of Cuthbert was exhumed 11 years after his burial and found not to have decayed - a sure sign of sanctity.



The Vikings are coming

The Viking attack on the Holy island of Lindisfarne in year 793 marked the start of the Viking Age. On a fog-shrouded morning in Lindisfarne, a lone monk examined a rocky beach, foraging for shellfish. Suddenly, in the distance, dragon-shaped prow heads of three Viking longships pierced the haze. A short time later, curious residents of a peaceful monastery, watching armoured foreigners come ashore with terrible weapons, are slaughtered or carried off as slaves while the monastery was plundered.



Vikings from Denmark, Norway and Sweden started international tourism collecting souvenirs from the countries around them. Swedish Vikings went down the rivers of Europe; Danish and Norwegian Vikings went westward to the British Isles, Iceland, Greenland and Wineland. The last one is now known as North America from Newfoundland to Rhode Island - leaving Columbus to be the second to find America. The Viking Age ended 1066 as the Viking descendant William conquered England after the Battle of Hastings.



Fleeing from the Viking raids, the community of monks left Lindisfarne carrying the remains of Cuthbert in 875, re-establishing Saint Cuthbert's shrine at Chester-le-Street and then in Durham in 995. Many years later, the monks returned to Lindisfarne to rebuild the Priory in the Norman style and which now stands as an impressive ruin. A famous manuscript, the "Lindisfarne Gospels", now in the British Library, was written by Bishop Eadfrid around 700 in honour of Saint Cuthbert.

Cuthbert's tomb can be seen today in the great Cathedral of Durham. In addition, Fenwick Lawson carved an original sculpture "Cuthbert of Farne" from an elm tree in 1983. The sculpture was positioned in the cloisters of Durham Cathedral and seen by millions of visitors. In 1999, the Northern Rock Foundation commissioned the same artist to cast Cuthbert of Farne in bronze. This remarkable sculpture depicts a contemplative Cuthbert, reflecting his life of prayer, peace and solitude.

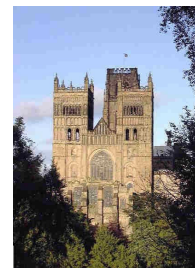


Lindisfarne is set on a rugged coast and in an atmospheric part of the United Kingdom. The great castle of Bamburgh on the nearby coast is massive by any standards. Grace Darling, the young girl who heroically rescued survivors from a shipwreck on the Farnes in 1838, was born in Bamburgh. Her family grave and memorial are in the churchyard of Saint Aidan's Church, Bamburgh with magnificent views over the sea to the Holy Island of Lindisfarne.

There are also spectacular ruins, particularly Tynemouth Priory and Castle, near Newcastle. In Jarrow, Saint Paul's Church, still in use, contains a fragment of an early Saxon Church, built of stones taken from Hadrian's Wall. This church formed part of the monastery in which the Venerable Bede (673-735) wrote his Ecclesiastical History of the English Nation and where he would have worshipped every day as an ordinary monk.

Stones from Hadrian's Wall can also be found in the crypt of Hexham Abbey.

For the visitors to Northumbria, Durham Cathedral is well worth a visit. With its unequalled position on top of a hill it has a true "wow" factor. Is it a great fortress or a church? In fact, it was both. Inside, the Norman building is full of symbolism and sacred geometry, most of which is lost on the modern mind but was well understood by our mediaeval ancestors.



North of Durham, the visitor can also see the more recent metal sculpture by Antony Gormley known as "The Angel of the North" erected as a memorial to the men, women and children who used to work, under considerable hardship, in the coal mines of Northumbria and whose spirits are now set free.

Enjoy this attunement and the power and spirituality not only of the Holy Island of Lindisfarne but of the whole area of Northumbria.
